Christian friendships are one of the best gifts the church can offer to people with hearing loss. Deaf people and people with hearing loss may feel isolated at Worship services. We can communicate in ways besides sound. Let's enjoy today's lesson in new ways!

🗖 Discuss:

- The Reverend Leo Yates, Jr. grew up in a family with Deaf people. "Some Deaf and hard-of-hearing people like music," he says. "There are Deaf and hard-of-hearing people with some degree of hearing. Add loudness, vibrations, the right acoustics, dramatization, amplification, AND sign language. The music comes alive!"
- Name two more things so activities, classes and worship can come alive.
- Practice the sign for Jesus. [Poke index finger into palm of opposite hand. Do this with both hands]
- Practice the sign for God. [Have the thumb and palm of your right hand face your cheek. Swing it above head your head. Pull it down a little bit]
- Practice the sign for Thank You. [Put right hand fingers, palms up. Brush your lips. Swing them down in an arc. Smile]
- Practice signing Thank You God.
- Tap your fingers on a table or desk. Or use musical wooden spoons. Now tap and Say Thank you Jesus [1-2 | 1-2] Thank you God [1-2 | 1]
- Have you sat in the bleachers at a sports game? To get the fans excited, people stomp their feet. Try it. Can others feel the vibration on the floor?
- Name two things you can do to greet a person who is deaf or hard of hearing [wave, use your iPad or phone and type Hi, or . . .].
- **Bonus:** What is liturgical dance?
