Theme: "All Are Welcome to the Table"



Call to Worship:

(Normally the Call to Worship includes a response through verbal words. This time instead of verbal response from the congregation after the Leader speaks there are hand motions.)

Leader: Welcome! Come it is time to Worship together!

People: (Clapping of hands.)

Leader: Let us lift praise of thanksgiving to God, creator of all.

People: (Raise hands and moves fingers as in celebration jazz hands.)

Leader: Let us worship God together!

Opening Prayer:

Lord, we gather together this day with praise in our hands, our minds, and our hearts. We thank You for all that You have provided for us. Thank you for all that You have created. Thank You for sending Your Son, Jesus Christ to remind us that You love us and we are to love one another. Amen.

Old Testament: Psalm 98

Scripture Text: John 15:9-17 (NSRV or NIV)

Sermon Thoughts:

Christ loves all and we are to love all who enter the space in which we worship together, whether in a building or in the openness of God's creation. There is no us or them. We are all welcomed to the table to eat together. No one is excluded.

Offering Prayer:

Lord, we give these gifts back to You. You have given us so much, a place to worship, many ways of expressing our praise to you, a place to live, food to eat, clothes to wear, and people who care about each and everyone of us. Thank You! Those two words just seem inadequate for all that you have provided us and all the things we take for granted at times. From within the deepest part of us, we say Thank You, and ask for Your blessings on these gifts as we go to help others. Amen.
